Leila, our EU Aid Volunteer continues to provide English Classes every Wednesday at 2:30 PM. The class is now welcoming mixed levels and focuses on teaching english through games and interactive methods that allow the students to improve their listening and speaking skills in a fun and friendly atmosphere









H.S.A continues School support program for the third month and supported many children so far. Throughout this period, the teachers have been using several alternative methods that help the students to understand and absorb the lessons easily in a non academic way. For the Arabic, English and Math classes, teachers have been using small boards instead of paper encouraging the students to write and to pay more attention to the teachers. Other activities included using children stories that are easy for children to read, interactive homework's, tests After three months, the teachers have observed good improvement in some of the students in their ability to read and write in English and Arabic. They are also performing better in exams The aims of the program are for the students to improve their educational level, create strong friendships between them and improve their self-confidence.

















For the second times, two capoeira sessions were given by "Martin", a volunteer from Argentina. Capoeira is a Afro-Brazilian martial art that combines elements of dance, acrobatics, and music. With the help of volunteers and through interactive games, Martin taught the kids basic movements of capoeira, percussion and songs.

The children enjoyed discovering a form of arts/sports from such a different culture .

The sessions were really fun allow the children to do some sports while using their creativity.







Workshop for children "learning Dabkah Dance"

H.S.A continues providing Dabke classes for children aged 9-12 years, every Thursday At 2:00 pm, after school in HSA center.

The classes are being delivered by the trainer "Tala".

At the beginning, the children learnedthe basic of dabkh then they started creating some movements with their trainer and chose some songs that suited their movements.

They did many shows in front of international delegations when they came to visit HSA. In December next month, they will perform at the Voices of freedom " show which " will take place at the Gate cafe in Nablus.











First Aid Workshop





First aid workshop was designed and delivered to reassure the youth and equip them with tools to assess emergency situations and to provide them with immediate first aid when accidents occur. It was divided into two sessions for 2 hours each, by "Ghaith Adham and Shadi Qotob".

The first part was theoretical and second part was more practical. Fifteen participants attended the workshop that was taught in an interactive and participative way by two paramedical professionals. We believe that it is vitally important young people learn about these basic skills. Prompt and appropriate First Aid saves lives.
